

Annex to the rules

COSTS OF ARBITRATION

A. Admission expenses

Independently of the administration expenses, the party applying for arbitration must pay a fixed charge of 300 euros for opening, recording and studying the case. This payment will not be returned.

B. Arbitrator fees

The amount of the arbitrators' fees will be calculated applying the stipulated percentages to each successive interval of the sum in dispute and adding up the figures thus obtained.

a) Arbitration ex aequo et bono

All arbitration proceedings will be subject to the following scale:

	Minimum %	Maximum %
Up to 18.000,00 €	300,00 €	10
Excess up to 60.000,00 €	1,5	6
Excess up to 150.000,00 €	0,8	3
Excess up to 300.000,00 €	0,5	2
Excess up to 450.000,00 €	0,3	1,5
Excess up to 601.000,00 €	0,2	0,6
Excess up to 1.202.000,00 €	0,1	0,3
Excess up to 3.000.000,00 €	0,05	0,15
Excess over 3.000.000,00 €	0,02	0,1

The figure obtained from the above calculation will apply in cases with a sole arbitrator, and be multiplied threefold if there are three arbitrators, who, unless otherwise agreed amongst them, will each earn one third of the overall figure, with a minimum of €300.00 per arbitrator.

b) Arbitration in law

In arbitration in law, the fees established for arbitration ex aequo et bono will be applied plus 20%.

C. Administration expenses

The amount of the administration expenses will be calculated by applying the stipulated percentages to each successive interval of the sum in dispute and adding up the figures thus obtained.

a) Arbitration ex aequo et bono

	Minimum %	Maximum %
Up to 18.000,00 €	180,00 €	2,5
Excess up to 60.100,00 €	0,75	1,25
Excess up to 150.000,00 €	0,50	0,75
Excess up to 300.500,00 €	0,20	0,40
Excess up to 450.700,00 €	0,10	0,20
Excess over 450.700,00 €	0,04	0,08

b) Arbitration in law

In arbitration in law, the expenses established for arbitration ex aequo et bono will be increased by 20%.

NOTE: The application of the relevant scales for arbitrators and administration charges, between the maximum and minimum, will be a discretionary power of the Court of Arbitration of Madrid. The sums indicated in the three sections above will be increased by the taxes applicable thereto at each moment.
